Annual MIP Leadership Conference in Fulda – a Report

Hannelore Reich once said, „I hope you will understand one day that in God's eyes, you are a princess, a wonderful and beautiful woman with many gifts. He loves you deeply and you are his precious daughter!”

Over 50 women of different ages from all corners of Germany met in Fulda in March of 2019 for the annual leadership conference. We praised God, we prayed, we fellowshiped and danced and were encouraged to keep on in our ministry efforts locally. We represented the groups we lead in our home area and shared news and answered prayers.

I have seldom experienced such a loving atmosphere as I did at this retreat. The ladies were aged 20 to 70, came from all different regions and had different responsibilities, and yet were able to quickly get to know each other, worship together and serve one another in love and humility. Despite our different backgrounds, denominations and ages, God joined us together in harmony and unity. It is wonderful to know that God can make such things possible! Each participant felt welcomed and appreciated there.

In small and large clusters of women, we prayed for every German state and city and prayer group. There were also teaching modules, times of encouragement and silent reflection in God's word. Then we shared our answers to the following questions: How did God speak to and work through the characters in the Bible? What are his promises? What is his direction for me and us in the next year? There was also time for personal confession and spiritual renewal, alone or with another woman to support us. It was very special to witness and experience this kind of support on the personal and ministry level.

I am very thankful for being able to attend this special weekend! Now I am home and serving in my area alone, but I know we are a strong group of women connected across the whole country in prayer for one another! Knowing this gives me courage to continue, with God's strength. I would like to thank the team who lovingly prepared this weekend for us and for all the kind and friendly encounters with other women I enjoyed while there.

My Journey with MIP

My name is Annegret Waidelich. My husband and I have three grown children and we live in Baden-Württemberg.



Before I got to know MIP (formerly Moms in Touch), I had a few years full of worry about one of our children. Despite excellent counseling, this child was proving quite difficult to raise in a healthy way. God brought me to another person, who was then able to guide me into deep prayer and fellowship with Jesus.

About a year later, two other mothers and I received a MIP handbook and were asked to read it and think about starting a local group. (At that time, these handbooks in German were still being paid for by donations from moms in the USA.) One of the ladies decided a week later to start a group and invited me over to pray. The group grew and we were all encouraged by the input at the MIP thank and praise event in Gärtingen in 1997. We began using the prayer sheets and praying with Bible verses. I noticed that Jesus was working in my life and I felt more peace. Jesus heard and answered my prayers and gave me hope. After two years we split the group and I became a group leader. A few years after that, Ingrid Giger, the country coordinator at that time, asked me to consider becoming a Contact Person. She helped me to organize my first MIP informational meeting at the YMCA in our town. Moms who attended were encouraged to begin their own groups by finding another mom to pray with.

My field of responsibility grew. My personal experiences with God and MIP group prayers gave me the courage to inspire other women to start praying for their children and schools as well! In 2007, we started caring for my 88-year-old mother-in-law in our home. In 2008, our MIP group split again to allow for more growth. I continued to meet with other women to pray. In 2012 I led the last regional thank and praise meeting. My regional coordinator advised me to pass on my MIP responsibility as Contact Person for Stuttgart to another woman. But I was still able to pray regularly

with two women by telephone, as we lived too far apart from each other to meet in person.

In 2014 we hired a Bulgarian live-in nurse to care for our aunt at our home. We helped her to learn German. I learned the Cyrillic alphabet from her and sensed a growing desire for Bulgarian women to learn about Moms in Prayer and the Four Steps of Prayer. In the summer of 2015, I asked our MIP Webmaster, Christel Moog, for a MIP booklet in Bulgarian. She said, „Hey, why don't you come to the MIP Europe Support Team Conference in Zurich this October?“ I did, and was welcomed there with open arms. My English wasn't great, but much of what was said was translated for me and I was able to understand what they were discussing and which prayer requests were named. At the end of April 2019, I was invited to become a Country Assistant for Bulgaria. I said yes! And to this day, I am so thankful that, along with other praying women, I can bring the needs and requests of all the European countries and Israel before God's throne. We pray that MIP groups will begin and grow there, and that mothers, children and teachers learn to place their hope in the living God.

My husband has always supported me on this journey, as I help the MIP ministry with my computer skills, my financial giving and my free time. I have been and am still able to serve in this capacity freely and joyfully. From the very difficult times raising my own children to helping other women find hope through praying for their children, I have come a long way and am happy about how God has guided me through these years.

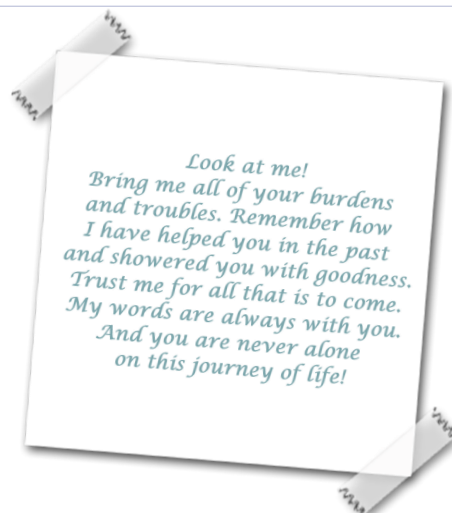
Post-it-Sticker
