

Our vision is that every school in the world would be covered in prayer.

Recently I, Sandra, noticed a postcard with the inscription,

"Courage is fear that has prayed".

I had bought it some time ago, but had not given it away so far. Now it resurfaced and reminded me of this year's Moms in Prayer annual verse:

"When I called, you answered me; you made me bold and stout-hearted." (Psalm 138:3 NIV)

I love the Word of God, it contains so many treasures, wonderful promises, and so much encouragement.

The annual verse for 2022 is such a treasure; it impressively shows us how God responds to prayers. It is part of a psalm of thanksgiving in which David praises God for his goodness and faithfulness and his intervention in (often hopeless) situations. David experienced time and again that God answered his prayers.

I am encouraged by this verse because it is as relevant today as it was in David's day.

If we come to Him in our distress and with all our worries and fears concerning our children, our families or the current situation in the world and "call upon" Him, God will hear us and give us new courage and strength.

"Courage" here does not necessarily mean that we immediately lose our fears, but rather that we may have assurance that God is by our side in fear (Deut. 31:8), that He will make us strong (Isa. 41:10), that He will help us (Isa. 41:13), that He will fight for us (Exodus 14:14), and that He will never turn away

from us (Joshua 1:5b).

With this assurance, our confidence and trust in God's sovereign intervention grows. We may be sure that God hears our prayers and that He will act at the right time. It may not happen immediately or in the way we hope, but it always happens in time and in accordance with God's perfect plan for each individual.

And so today I want to encourage you to confidently bring all your worries, needs and fears before God in prayer, trusting that He hears you and that He will give you new courage and strength for your situation.

My name is Sandra Stüer. I am married, I have two daughters (born in 2007 and 2010) and I live in Potsdam with my family.

A few years ago, I became aware of Moms in Prayer through a Christian blog. The idea of praying together with other moms for our children and their schools appealed to me and I was hoping to join a MiP group in Potsdam. Unfortunately, this was not the case as there was no group in Potsdam or the surrounding area.

I ordered the MiP material and tried to implement the knowledge gained in prayer for our daughters alone.

For professional reasons we moved to Brussels in September 2020, and I again hoped to join a MiP

group. I had already contacted Moms in Prayer Belgium in advance, but unfortunately had to hear again that there was no local group, which seemed inconceivable in a city like Brussels.

I continued to pray alone for our two daughters and also for a prayer partner.

In February 2021, I participated in a MiP Online Day from Belgium, and I continue to marvel at how richly I was blessed by it. God had packed a little treasure chest for me for that day, the contents of which I was allowed to discover bit by bit throughout the day. I finally met other MiP women and was greatly encouraged by their personal testimonies. I was able to practice concretely and in community the four steps of prayer and prayer in harmony and also received an invitation to pray online together with two wonderful MiP women in the future. In addition, this day brought me into contact with the Belgian MiP team, and I was able to contribute to the translation of the Belgian prayer calendar into French and German, found two wonderful local prayer partners (even though we were mostly only able to meet online due to the pandemic), and gained many valuable experiences.

In October 2021, we went back to Potsdam as a family, where I have been the contact person, ever since.

In addition, I have been able to support our federal coordinator for Germany, Manuela Woldt, as an assistant since the end of 2021.

My name is Anja Weinmann. I am married to Torsten and blessed with three boys born in 1997, 1999 and 2003. I was born in Karlsruhe, but have been living in the Lahn-Dill district of Hessen for over 25 years. My story with Moms in Prayer started with the fact that I just love to pray in community! I had already experienced so much in my teenage years through joint prayer that I wished for such a group also as a mom..., I actually did not know that such a thing already existed: Moms praying for their children and their schools..., but

God is so faithful: He let me know about a MiP group in my own village by a divine "coincidence", and so HE answered this wish even before I prayed for it! So I have been enthusiastically involved since

2003 over the years in various "functions": as fellow prayer, leader, contact person and finally as area coordinator. In the last few years the desire grew in me to support this great prayer network more in the background, i.e. to be in prayer for prayer, to encourage women with the prayer calendar, to create prayer sheets, to lead prayer times and everything else that has to do with prayer. I was already able to explore this as an assistant for one year at the side of the former prayer coordinator Martina Rollbühler and now I was allowed to assume this position in October 2021.

- We tasted that day how good and great and faithful the Lord is.

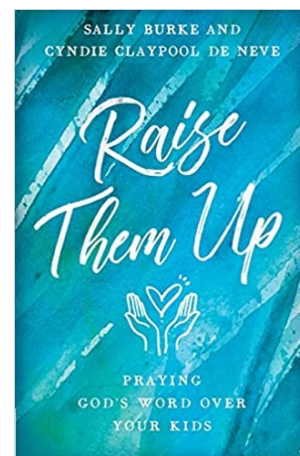
We are very happy that local meetings are taking place again.

Our vision is that every school in the world would be covered in prayer.



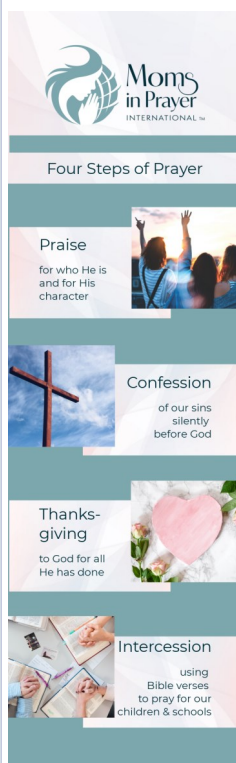

"Special circumstances require special measures"

I heard this phrase from my grandparents quite often in their everyday lives as self-employed farmers in East Germany. As a child, I was not aware of their particular circumstances, but today I know too well about the challenges they faced back then.

We, too, are currently living in and with great challenges. In the Bible we find some heroes of faith who also took special measures in special circumstances.

One of them is Nehemiah. His action in faith in a destroyed city, confronted with many things that seemed impossible and attacks on his life, is a model for us in our ministry at Moms in Prayer at this time.

Nehemiah previously lived a comfortable life in an exalted social position and with a very good income. He lived in abundance and was carefree. But GOD did not let him rest, and thus he inquired of his brother how his hometown and his people were there.

Does this seem familiar to us? Mostly we also live a quiet life, are our needs met. We pray together for our children and stand for their needs. But sometimes God also doesn't let us rest and uses our circumstances in order to bring us deeper into prayer and thus more near to HIS heart.

In the past two years it seemed to us at Moms in Prayer that our hearts were widened quite far beyond our personal concerns. Like Nehemiah, we began to focus on the next generation and its challenges. We joined as one in prayer and placed JESUS as a foundation and cornerstone in the empty schools of our country. Upon this, in faith, like Nehemiah, we built walls of protection around our children and the schools. In continued prayer, new bricks were added week after week. It is purely a work of faith.

Like Nehemiah, we trust that we are following GOD's call, and we unite in prayer so that every school in Germany has a prayer wall around it.

On the face of it this is an impossible work, but our GOD works in the invisible realm. He doesn't depend on our activities and our works. We trust HIS words and then stand up courageously to walk in HIS ways in the power of the LORD.

I am personally encouraged by the examples of

the heroes of faith like Noah, Abraham or Sarah from Heb. 11, whose lives show that without faith it is impossible to please GOD (see Heb. 11:6). Even though my faith often feels as small as a mustard seed, I want to trust HIS Word and run the race for HIS glory, in HIS strength.

I want to challenge you: Join in and stand boldly where GOD has planted you and flourish for HIS glory. Rise, stand in the rows of the praying mothers and grandmothers and look at our GOD who works miracles in the lives of our children and grandchildren.

Nehemiah used the rubble on the ground to rebuild the walls. Let us use the current challenges as an opportunity to enter intensely and faithfully into prayer. Join us as we bring our worries and burdens to the Lord, worship Him, confess our guilt, thank Him for everything in everything, and then boldly place our intercessions before His throne. Thus united, we build the walls of protection around local schools. Every prayer is so valuable!

We as the MiP Germany team and our leadership stand ready to pray, and we look forward to hearing from you. Pray for opportunities that GOD has prepared to tell moms and grandmas about your experiences in prayer. Take JESUS with you in your everyday life and commit your ways to HIM.

Anja, our prayer coordinator writes:

In March, I wrote in the cover letter of the prayer calendar that I would like to collect prayer requests. It started when the area coordinator Manuela Gimbel from the LDK circle was touched by the verse from Nehemiah 1:2: „...and I questioned them about the Jewish remnant that survived the exile, and also about Jerusalem.“ For her, this was the starting point to inquire personally of educators and teachers how they were doing..., her telling about it in turn inspired me to do the same and you in turn inquired.



These are now the collected responses. Let God put on your heart what you particularly want to stand up for and add your own observations. In this way, together we can rebuild the broken walls of the schools.

- Insecurity and turmoil of the students
- Tolerance and normal interaction (especially with illnesses) hardly exists
- Many students with mental illnesses (panic attacks)
- Fears of failing and not keeping up in class
- Fear of Corona and its consequences
- No good and loving relationships in the family due to prolonged quarantine periods
- Mental and physical abuse
- Prayer for the parents' homes, lack of respect/discipline, parents first look for the teacher's fault
- Outdated, ramshackle school system
- School system: that people get into the school management who are called to do so
- School management: heart for the teachers, not only look at what the parents or the press think...
- That the atmosphere in the school administration becomes better and fairer, and that local teachers and employees make the decisions, not some committee far removed from the situation.
- Christians take up this profession. They require a mature personality
- Part-time employment of teachers. In many places it is not defined what a part-time worker does. Injustice can develop from this
- Fairness in the selection of school board members, that a close look is taken
- Overwork of teachers (many leave teaching because of this)
- Disrespectful behavior by pupils towards teachers, not accepting limits
- Thoughtless hurling out insults among pupils
- Only 35% of the parents think that they are responsible for the upbringing of their children, 4% even say that institutions are solely responsible for it
- Parents, even Christians, think that young children should be cared for by pedagogical professionals in any case, if the parents themselves have no pedagogical training. As a result, many young children now spend more time with educational professionals than with their own parents
- More importance is attached to care outside the family than to care from parents

Every prayer is a brick in the wall of protection.
